About this Assessment

The Demographic Regeneration Maturity Assessment evaluates the enabling conditions that support long-term demographic renewal.

Rather than measuring demographic outcomes, the assessment examines four interconnected human conditions—Resources, Opportunity, Confidence, and Support—to identify strengths, structural barriers, and priorities for improvement.

Purpose

- Establish a common framework for assessment.
- Identify strengths and structural gaps.
- Support evidence-informed decision-making.



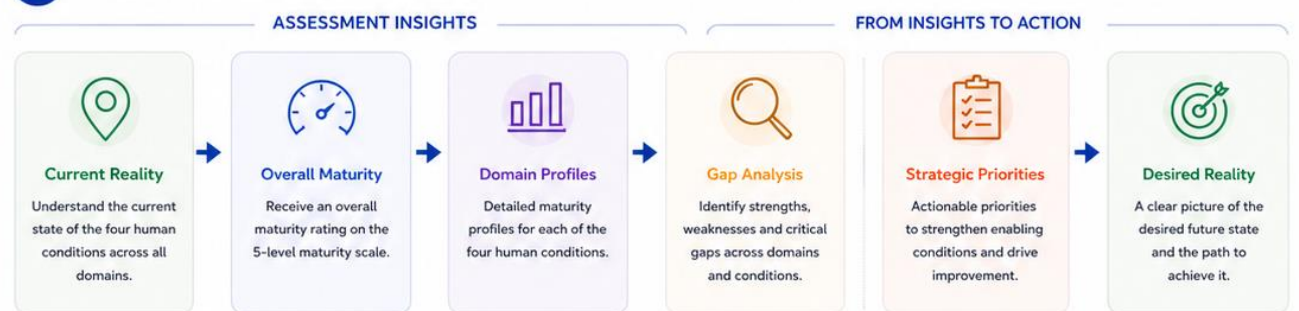

DEMOGRAPHIC REGENERATION MATURITY MATRIX

The five maturity levels describe the degree to which enabling conditions support family formation and long-term demographic renewal across the four human conditions.

ASSESSMENT DOMAIN	1 CONSTRAINED Conditions severely limit family formation.	2 EMERGING Conditions are developing but inconsistent.	3 STABLE Core conditions are established but gaps remain.	4 SUPPORTIVE Conditions actively support and encourage family formation.	5 THRIVING Conditions are resilient and mutually reinforcing.
 RESOURCES Capacity for establishing and sustaining family life.	Basic resources are insufficient to enable many households to establish and sustain family life.	Resource conditions are improving, but affordability and financial security remain inconsistent.	Most households possess sufficient resources to establish and sustain family life, although structural barriers remain.	Resources actively enable family formation through affordable housing, stable employment, and long-term economic security.  OPPORTUNITY Conditions enabling relationships and parenthood.	Social and economic opportunities to form and sustain families are severely constrained. Opportunities actively encourage family formation by reducing structural barriers and enabling long-term planning.  CONFIDENCE Confidence in pursuing and raising a family.	Widespread uncertainty limits confidence in the ability to establish and sustain family life. High confidence enables individuals and families to make long-term commitments with security and optimism.  SUPPORT Social, institutional and community support.	Institutional, community, and social support are insufficient to meet the needs of families.	Support systems are developing, but remain fragmented, inconsistent, or difficult to access.	Families can generally rely on accessible and consistent support throughout family life.	Coordinated support systems actively strengthen family wellbeing across all stages of the family lifecycle.	Comprehensive support systems consistently enable families to flourish across generations and changing life circumstances.
